"I found it pretty friendly, everyone is amiable to students, I'm flying the Jabiru because that was the one I had read the most about and it was affordable from the point of view of buying a plane in the future." said Carey.

"The thing that appeals to me most about flying, is you can own a plane, come out to Cambridge take off for the day to places you couldn't easily get to by road." said Carey
